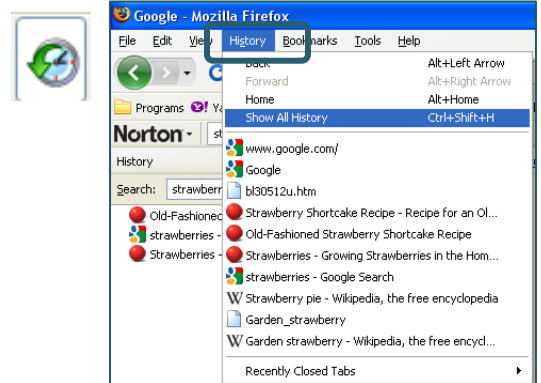


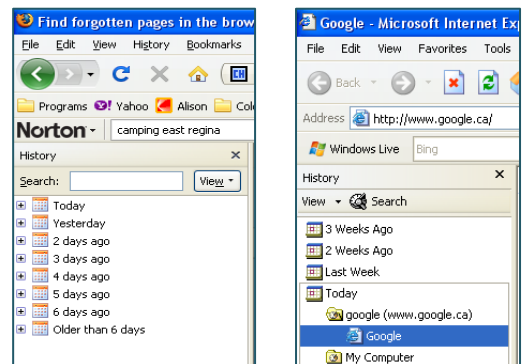
Search History

How many websites do you visit before finding what you want? How often do you get sidetracked in your search, veering off topic because you've discovered other sites of interest? How many times do you recall something that you'd like to read, but can't remember where you saw it?

Whether you use Explorer or Firefox, the History feature can be a great tool to revisit previously viewed pages. To search your Internet history, you can either click on the History tab or button, or you can simply press Ctrl+H to open the browser history.



The default view in Firefox and Explorer shows the search results based on the date viewed, i.e. Today, Yesterday, etc. Remembering the specific day you were on the site helps to narrow the list of results.



If you don't remember the date, you can use the Search feature located within History. Type a specific keyword related to the page in the Search bar. In the example to the right, typing "strawberries" narrows the list of sites viewed to sites specifically related to strawberries.

Hopefully by using History and the Search feature located in History, you'll find what you're looking for a lot easier than attempting to recreate your search in Google.
